How will Pathways to Graduation (P2G) help me to achieve my goals?

IF YOU ARE 18 TO 21 YEARS OLD, WE'LL HELP YOU EARN YOUR HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA AND **PREPARE** FOR WORK AND COLLEGE

17 year old students may enroll with extenuating circumstances and parent or guardian permission, though final determinations are made by a school administrator.



## Why should I enroll in P2G?

**We will help you earn your High School Equivalency *and* prepare you for college and your career.**

The High School Equivalency Diploma will create many new opportunities for you—enrolling in college, attending a vocational training program, and starting a job in a career of your choice. We want to make sure you are prepared to succeed. Successful completion of P2G means that you will leave this Program with your High School Equivalency Diploma prepared to begin college and your career.

## How will P2G help me prepare for life after the High School Equivalency Exam?

**P2G provides excellent academic preparation as well as college and career coaching.**

In addition to excellent academic preparation from our teachers and building life skills with our counselors, while you are enrolled in P2G you will receive individual college and career coaching. Coaches will help you:

- Learn the skills to find a job
- Create a resume
- Prepare for interviews
- Apply to college
- Go on college visits
- Explore different career opportunities
- Find paid and unpaid internships

## Who will help me achieve my goals?

- **Teachers** help you with your academic work and meet graduation expectations
- **Counselors** help you build the skills needed to succeed in college, at home and in the workplace
- **Coaches and Coordinators** help you find paid and unpaid internships



Additionally, College and Career Resource Centers are equipped with computers and a resource library to help you plan for work and college. You can access the center by scheduling an appointment, dropping in anytime, or by asking your coach, teacher or counselor for more information.

## When will I be eligible to take the High School Equivalency exam?

In order to graduate from P2G, you will need to complete a high quality personal statement essay, resume, cover letter and position paper (Graduation Expectations). In addition, you must receive a score on your readiness exam high enough to show you will succeed on the High School Equivalency exam. We strive to see you succeed on the High School Equivalency exam and beyond. Throughout your enrollment in the program, P2G staff will work with you to ensure your academic skills match your college and career goals.

**Did you know? The GED® has been replaced in New York State with the TASC™ exam. Although the test will be harder, not much else will change. The test is still free, and you will still get your High School Equivalency Diploma once you pass the TASC™**
