

Health Services

Medical Clinic

Every child who comes into one of The Children's Aid Society's clinics receives comprehensive, confidential and coordinated examinations and treatment. Children are assigned to a primary care provider who serves as his or her "medical home." The Children's Aid Society Community School Medical Clinic at P.S.5 has a nurse practitioner who provides first aid, acute care, vaccinations and physicals for students and siblings. A pediatrician is available to students once a week. Services are offered during the academic year Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 4:30pm. During the summer, Medical Assistance support staff are on-site for referrals and first aid.

Health Care Access Program (H-CAP)

Every Wednesday our HCAP Insurance specialist is on-site to meet with families who are already enrolled in the program, or with families who would like to enroll.

- *Review of family information to determine eligibility*
- *Enrollment in programs for which the family is eligible*
- *Ongoing support with insurance issues arising while enrolled*

Dental Services

The Dental Service offers full preventive and curative dental care to students at the dental clinic suite inside the Children's Aid Society Medical Clinic. Dental services are designed to complement children's medical needs by providing primary care such as:

- *Examinations*
- *Restorative care (such as dental fillings)*
- *Prophylaxis (dental cleaning)*
- *Fluoride treatment and sealants*
- *Referrals*

Services are available the full academic year as well as during the summer.

Health Educator

The Health Educator provides education on health issues emphasizing those that are most developmentally relevant to latency. Services are available the full academic year including summer.




Summer Camps

The Children's Aid Society at P.S. 5 offers clinic services, early childhood programs, and parent classes throughout the summer months. For school-aged children, three camps operate in July and August to provide engaging experiences in diverse settings.

Home-Based Summer Camp

Offers recreational and enrichment programming organized around a theme. Each day includes cultural and arts programming, literature and enrichment, and recreation activities. Children ages 5 to 10 who enjoy day trips and school-based activities will like Home-Based Camp. Our Home-Based Summer Camp capacity is **120** students.



Wagon Road Summer Camp

Consists of both specialist-guided and counselor-led activities in a natural woodlands setting. A bus leaves P.S.5 daily to take campers to Wagon Road, where our capacity is **50** students.

The Alvin Ailey Summer Dance Camp

The Alvin Ailey Summer Dance Camp is a dance-focused program with the capacity of **100** students from various schools and community centers.
