

CUNY COLLEGE NOW — CURRENT 9TH, 10TH, & 11TH GR.

The CUNY College Now program introduces students to interdisciplinary learning in an array of subject areas. Most courses take place on CUNY campuses, allowing students a unique glimpse into life as a college student. Pre-college courses are open to current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders while college-level courses are open to current 10th and 11th graders.

Who's Eligible

Current 9th, 10th, or 11th graders (varies by course offering) planning to attend a Renewal School in Fall 2016

Pre-College Courses

Course #1: Backyard Toxicology

Who? Current 9th, 10th, or 11th graders

Where? A.P. Randolph High School (Manhattan)

What? Basic toxicology concepts are drawn from students' existing knowledge as students learn how to query the EPA's Toxic Release Inventory, use MSDS sheets to research potential health effects, and more.

Course #2: Aquatic Ecosystems Science

Who? Current 9th, 10th, or 11th graders

Where? Brooklyn College Campus (Brooklyn)

What? The goal of this course is to study the interdependence of plants and animals and their physical environment and how we as humans take advantage of and destroy the living environment around us.

College-Level Courses

Course #3: Introduction to the Digital Toolbox (DD101)

Who? Current 10th and 11th graders

Where? Hostos Community College Campus (Bronx)

What? This course provides students with understanding of the essential software for beginning careers as digital designers, including Adobe Creative Suite software and Apple's iMovie, Garageband, and KeyNote.

Course #4: American Government (POL101)

Who? Current 10th and 11th graders

Where? Hostos Community College Campus (Bronx)

What? This course identifies the major institutions of local, state, and national government, their powers, and interrelationships, focusing on the U.S. Constitution.

Course #5: Introduction to Computer Art (HUA125)

Who? Current 10th and 11th graders

Where? LaGuardia Community College Campus (Queens)

What? This course provides an introduction to all phases of computer graphics applications, including draft and paint modes, fills, textures, brushes, graphic tools and color blending through exercises in drawing, painting, graphic design, illustration and advertising techniques.

Course #6: Introduction to Business (BA10)

Who? Current 11th graders

Where? LaGuardia Community College Campus (Queens)

What? This course focuses on the fundamentals of management, marketing, finance and business in the global environment, with special attention to the issues involved in entrepreneurship, franchising and formulating a business.

EXPANDED — CURRENT 10TH & 11TH GRADERS

The Expanded program provides current 10th and 11th graders at Renewal High Schools with learning experiences beyond traditional classrooms. Students work as apprentices to learn to teach and mentor younger students in areas such as the arts and video production, helping to prepare participants for the working world. Participants have the opportunity to exit the program with academic credit, a working portfolio, and the chance to participate in paid internships with the apprenticeship provider during the following year.

Who's Eligible

Current 10th and 11th graders planning to attend a Renewal School in Fall 2016. Participating students must be age 16 years or older by October 1, 2016.

SUMMER BRIDGE — CURRENT 8TH GRADERS

The Summer Bridge program provides current 8th graders entering Renewal High schools in Fall 2016 with structures to organize their work and support their social-emotional growth to prepare them for success in high school. Summer Bridge programs will take place at the student's new high school, introducing students to their new school environment. Summer Bridge programs run for 4 hours per day. Two hours each day are dedicated to "Organized for Life," providing students with social-emotional preparation for high school and the organizational skills needed to succeed. The remaining two hours are dedicated to either Math or ELA study, depending on the individual needs of each student. CAREERCLUE — CURRENT 9TH, 10TH, & 11TH GRADERS

The CareerCLUE program (Community Learning, Understanding, and Experience) program supports both students' academic skills and confidence, developing understanding of key issues in New York City-related career options. Current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders attending Renewal High Schools have the opportunity to earn a \$500 attendance incentive for their participation in the program. Delivered in partnership with classroom teachers and Solar One, a NYC-based non-profit environmental education organization, CareerCLUE

explores topics such as emerging clean technologies, renewable energy, battery storage, demand management, water technologies, biomimicry, storm water management, and hydroponics.

WRITING WORKSHOP — CURRENT 9TH, 10TH, & 11TH GR.

The Writing Workshop program for current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders at Renewal High Schools strengthens student's writing skills while providing the opportunity to earn elective ELA credits. In the investigative journalism unit, students will research and profile prominent Americans and write biographical articles. In the personal essay unit, students study several formats including blogs, traditional narratives, and humorous essays. The unit will culminate with students producing a short personal essay that can be used during the college application process.
