Proposed Charter Revisions Community Partnership Charter School, an existing charter school located at 241 Emerson Place Brooklyn, New York 11205 (K- 4 th) and 114 Kosciuszko St, Brooklyn, NY 11216 (5 th - 8 th) in Community District (“CSD”) 13, currently serves 411 students in grades K-8, and proposes to merge with Beginning with Children Charter School II, an existing charter school located at 214 Heyward Street, Brooklyn, New York 11206 in CSD 14, which currently serves 149 students in grades K-2. If the merger is approved, Community Partnership Charter School would be the successor education corporation under the new name “Community Partnership Charter School Education Corporation.” Following the merger, the schools would continue under their current names. Each education corporation seeks a revision to its charter to permit it to merge with the other education corporation. The proposed merger would be effective July 1, 2014, or at the beginning of the next succeeding fiscal quarter after final approval.	

Please note that post-merger there would be only one EIN number and one NYC vendor number for both schools as all assets, liabilities and contracts would be under the corporate structure of the successor education corporation.
