Details: This public hearing is open to anyone interested in learning about the following charter renewal and revision for a school located in **Community School District 13 in Brooklyn.**

Achievement First Endeavor Charter School is in its second charter term [2011-2015]. This is the school's ninth year of operation. Achievement First Endeavor Charter School seeks a renewal of its charter. It also seeks a revision to its charter to change the school's enrollment plan to increase its total authorized enrollment from 947 students to 1,064 students. Achievement First Endeavor Charter School expects to reach its full capacity of 1,064 students in grades K-12 during the 2015-2016 academic year.

The mission of Achievement First is to deliver on the promise of equal educational opportunity for all of America's children. We believe that all children, regardless of race or economic status, can succeed if they have access to a great education. Achievement First schools will provide all of our students with the academic and character skills they need to graduate from top colleges, to succeed in a competitive world and to serve as the next generation of leaders for our communities.
