The Amended Proposed Co-Location of a New Transfer High School (07X557) with Samuel Gompers Career and Technical Education High School (07X655) and New Visions Charter High School for Advanced Math and Science II (84XTBD) in Building X655 Beginning in 2012-2013

I. Description of the subject and purpose of the proposed item under consideration.

On December 22, 2011, the New York City Department of Education (“DOE”) issued a proposal to co-locate a new transfer high school, 07X557, in building X655 beginning in 2012-2013. Transfer schools are small, academically rigorous high schools designed to reengage over-age, under-credited students. Students designated as “over-age, under-credited” are considered to be two or more years behind his or her expected age and credit accumulation. 07X557 would provide a rigorous and engaging academic curriculum and would prepare students for post-secondary education and work. Building X655 is located at 455 Southern Boulevard, Bronx, NY 10455, within the geographical confines of Community School District 7 (“District 7”). If this proposal and the corresponding proposals (described below) are approved, 07X557 would be co-located in building X655 with Samuel Gompers Career and Technical Education High School (07X655, “Samuel Gompers”) and New Visions Charter High School for Advanced Math and Science II (84XTBD, “AMS II”). A “co-location” means that two or more school organizations are located in the same building and may share common spaces like auditoriums, gymnasiums, libraries, and cafeterias.

This amended notice and its corresponding amended Educational Impact Statement (“EIS”) corrects a typographical error in the title of the original proposal, which listed AMS II’s DBN as 84KTBD instead of 84XTBD.

In a separate EIS, the DOE proposed to phase out and eventually close Samuel Gompers, an existing school serving students in grades nine through twelve, which is currently located in building X655.

The DOE proposed to phase out Samuel Gompers after an extensive review of data and community feedback indicating that the school lacks the capacity to turn around quickly to better support student needs.

If the proposal to phase out Samuel Gompers is approved, Samuel Gompers would no longer admit new ninth-grade students after the conclusion of the 2011-2012 school year.

The school's enrollment would decrease gradually over the next three years, and the school would complete its phase-out in June 2015. The details of the phase-out proposal can be found on the DOE's Web site at

In the event that the phase-out of Samuel Gompers is not approved, the DOE would re-examine the availability of space in building X655 and may, if appropriate, revise this co-location proposal.

In another separate EIS, the DOE also proposed to open and co-locate a new charter high school, AMS II, in building X655 beginning in 2012-2013. If that proposal is approved, 07X557 would also be co-located in building X655 with AMS II throughout the course of its phase-in and thereafter. AMS II would be open to students through a charter lottery application process, and students who reside in District 7 would receive priority in the lottery. The proposed co-location of 07X557 in building X655 is part of the DOE's central goal to create new school options that would better serve future students and the community at large. 07X557 would prepare over-age, under-credited students for post-secondary education and/or work. 07X557 would have a rolling admissions policy, accepting students throughout the year who are 16 years of age and older and who have attended another high school for at least one year.

In 2010-2011, X655 had a target capacity of 1,348 students, but the building enrolled a total of 788 students, yielding a target building utilization rate of 58%. In the current 2011-2012 school year, the building is serving approximately 676 students, yielding a target utilization rate of 50%.

If this co-location proposal is approved, 07X557 would open in building X655 in September 2012 and would serve approximately 130-170 students in grades nine through twelve. In each subsequent year through 2014-2015, the school would enroll approximately 50 additional students. 07X557 is expected to reach full scale in terms of enrollment in 2014-2015, when it would serve approximately 230-270 students in grades nine through twelve.

In 2015-2016, once Samuel Gompers has completed its phase-out and both 07X557 and AMS II have reached full scale, there would be approximately 770-930 students served in the building, which would yield a target building utilization rate of approximately 57-69%.
