

Resolution Regarding the Proposed Extension and Expansion of the Temporary Co-location of the Middle School Grades of Harlem Prep Charter School (84M708) with M.S. 224 Manhattan East School for Arts & Academics (04M224), Renaissance Charter High School for Innovation (84M433), and Success Academy Charter School – Harlem 3 (84M385) in Building M099 through the 2014-2015 School Year

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-h(2-a), the Chancellor prepared an educational impact statement (“EIS”) and Building Utilization Plan (“BUP”), published and filed on February 28, 2014, on the proposed extension and expansion of the temporary co-location of the middle school grades of Harlem Prep Charter School (84M708) with M.S. 224 Manhattan East School for Arts & Academics (04M224), Renaissance Charter High School for Innovation (84M433), and Success Academy Charter School – Harlem 3 (84M385) in building M099 through the 2014-2015 School Year (the “proposal”); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-g(8), the Panel for Educational Policy (the “Panel”) undertook a public review process for review and comment on the proposal; and

WHEREAS, such review process included notice of the proposal via the Department of Education’s (the “Department’s”) internet website and circulation of the notice of proposal to all community superintendents, community district education councils, community boards, and school based management teams; and

WHEREAS, such notice further included: a) a description of the purpose and substance of the proposal; b) information regarding where the full text of the proposal could be obtained; c) the name, office, address, email, and telephone number of the Department representative from whom information concerning the proposal could be obtained; d) the date, time, and place of any hearing on the proposal; e) the date, time, and place of the meeting of the Panel at which the Panel was to vote on the proposal; and f) information on how to submit written or oral comments regarding the proposal; and

WHEREAS, such notice and public review process commenced on February 28, 2014, at least forty-five days in advance of the May 29, 2014 meeting of the Panel at which the proposal came before the Panel for a vote; and

WHEREAS, on April 10, 2014, the Department issued an amended notice for the proposal which provided updated information regarding the date of the Panel vote on the proposal, well as updated contact information for the Department office representative from whom information may be obtained regarding this proposal; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law 2590-h(2-a), the Chancellor held a joint public hearing on the proposal with the District 4 Community Education Council and the impacted school leadership teams, at which all interested parties had an opportunity to present comments or concerns on the proposal; and

WHEREAS, following the public review and comment period, the Panel made available to the public, including via the Department's internet web site, an assessment of all public comments concerning the proposal; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public comments included a summary and analysis of the issues raised and any significant suggested alternatives; a statement of the reasons why any significant alternatives were not incorporated into the proposal; a description of any changes to the proposal as a result of the public comments; and information as to where the full text of any approved proposal may be obtained; and

WHEREAS, the Chancellor recommends that the Panel approve the proposal; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Panel to approve the proposal; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that in accordance with Education Law § 2590-g, the Panel for Educational Policy hereby approves the proposed extension and expansion of the temporary co-location of the middle school grades of Harlem Prep Charter School (84M708) with M.S. 224 Manhattan East School for Arts & Academics (04M224), Renaissance Charter High School for Innovation (84M433), and Success Academy Charter School – Harlem 3 (84M385) in building M099 through the 2014-2015 School Year.
