M.S. 582 students will graduate with a digital portfolio of projects that include performance-based assessments, academic unit projects, community projects, digital photography, video clips, writing pieces, and reflection essays. Our teachers guide students as they engage in hands-on projects in our state-of-the-art MAC computer lab and fabrication lab that supports web design, arts portfolios, animation, robotics, coding, woodworking, architecture design modeling, clay work, 3-D print modeling, and urban planning. In our Greenhouse classroom students are growing fresh salad and colorful flowers. M.S. 582 students have the opportunity to work with our partners at the BEAM Center, Salvadori Center, BRIC Media Arts, NYSunworks, CUNY CityTech, and Pratt Institute. All of our specialized programming, including The Leader in Me, is designed with college- and career-readiness in mind and preparing our scholars to get accepted into the specialized high schools in NYC.
