

**Proposed Zone Changes Impacting PS 56, PS 3, and PS 6, in District 31**  
**Beginning in the 2015-2016 School Year**

The New York City Department of Education (DOE) and the District 31 Community Education Council have identified a need to change the current zones for PS 56, PS 3, and PS 6.

***Why is the DOE proposing to make these zone changes?***

- To account for the capacity of new building R062, on 644 Bloomingdale Road, slated to open for the 2015-2016 school year.
- To alleviate PS 3's zone so that the school will eventually no longer need the capacity of the annex at Mount Loretto.
- To include some students in the new zone from PS 6 who live closest to the new building.

***When would this zoning change be implemented?***

- The proposed zone changes would take effect for the 2015-2016 school year

***What changes might District 31 families expect as a result of this proposed re-zoning?***

- Some residents in the southern portion of the PS 56 zone may now be zoned for the new school at building R062.
- Some residents in the northern portion of the PS 3 zone may now be zoned for the new school at building R062.
- Some residents in the northeast portion of the PS 6 zone may now be zoned for the new school at building R062.
- The map on the back shows the proposed zone line changes.

***Who does this rezoning proposal impact?***

- Incoming kindergarten students or students that are new to NYC schools in 2015-2016.
- All currently enrolled students at PS 56, PS 3, and PS 6 may remain in their school.
- Sibling priority, as determined by CEC 31, may be applicable.

***How will this rezoning change student enrollment and space at PS 56, PS 3, and PS 6?<sup>1</sup>***

- PS 56's total enrollment is expected to decrease from 723 students to 610-710 students. This will decrease the building utilization from approximately 103% to 90%-100%.
- PS 3's total enrollment is expected to decrease from 1,019 students to 560-660 students. This will decrease the building utilization from approximately 128%<sup>2</sup> to 100%-110%.<sup>3</sup> This enrollment decrease will ultimately allow PS 3 to serve all of its students in its main building, and eventually eliminate the need for PS 3's annex at Mount Loretto.
- PS 6's total enrollment is expected to decrease from 757 students to 630-730 students. This will decrease the building utilization from approximately 122% to 105%-115%.

***How will this re-zoning decision be made?***

- The DOE proposed zoning changes to the District 31 CEC at a public meeting on April 7, 2014.
- The CEC collects community feedback.

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<sup>1</sup> Current enrollment is based on the Audited Register as of October 31, 2013. Organizational capacity and utilization are based on 2012-2013 Blue Book Capacity.

<sup>2</sup> Includes PS 3's annex at Mount Loretto, with a capacity of 220 seats.

<sup>3</sup> Planned capacity does not include PS 3's annex at Mount Loretto.

- The CEC is responsible for approving zoning changes. CEC 31 anticipates voting on this proposal during their May 5, 2014 meeting.

If this proposal is approved, starting in 2015-2016, the zone for the new school in building R062 is determined by the shape outlined in black:
