


New York City Graduation Rates Class Of 2013 (2009 Cohort)

The 2013 graduation rate is based on the cohort of students starting 9th grade in 2009.


Percentage of Graduates

4-Year Rate



Longitudinal NYC and NY State Graduation and Discharge Rates




- NYC Traditional Calculation

NYC Four, Five, and Six Year Graduation Rates




Graduation Rates by Diploma Type Over Time




Four Year Graduation and Dropout Rates By Ethnicity




