Online Learning for Students Displaced by Hurricane Sandy

Are you a middle or high school student displaced by Hurricane Sandy?

- Middle and high school students who are unable to attend their own school due to the impact of the storm may be eligible to take courses online through an extension of the iZone.

What courses are available?

- There are a number of courses in ELA, math, social studies, and science, for grades 6-12.
- All courses will be taught by certified New York City teachers and meet New York State Education Department regulations.

What do I need to do to begin taking online courses?

1. First, contact us:
 - a. Complete the online form <http://www.ilearnnyc.net/virtualllearning2012>, or
 - b. You can call us at 718-642-5885 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.; leave a message if you call outside those hours.
2. Second, we will contact your school to verify that you are unable to attend because of the storm and determine what course(s) would be appropriate for you. We will get back in touch with you after that to talk about your options.
3. Finally, to access the courses, you will need an internet-connected computer, whether at home, a local public library, or another place. We will match you with a nearby location if you need help.
