Operations and Budget Support

- > Network encouraged schools to share resources with other schools on the campus as the demand becomes less intense at the phase-out school
 - Example: School for Community Research and Learning in the Bronx collaborates with three schools on its campus to offer joint Advanced Placement (AP) classes and extracurricular activities for students
- > Central allocated over \$3 million in additional funding to schools to support direct services to students, professional development activities, supplemental instructional materials and supplies, and the implementation of strategies to increase parental and student involvement
- > Over \$6.5 million of funding has been dedicated to:
 - Curriculum and staff development: \$1.4 million
 - Coaching and mentoring: \$615,000
 - Before- and after-school programs: \$4.5 million

Instructional Support and Individualized Student Plans

- > Achievement coaches visit schools weekly to:
 - Support teachers and administrators in implementation of citywide instructional expectations and the Danielson Framework
 - Facilitate regular after-school professional development sessions for teachers and administrators
- > Network supports schools in using a comprehensive data tool to track:
 - Student progress, demographics, and academic achievement
 - The classes and exams a student still needs to pass
 - School-specific comments and suggestions based on what each student needs to complete in order to graduate
- > Using the data tool, schools create individualized student support plans to:
 - Share with families the graduation requirements each student has fulfilled, is close to fulfilling, or needs additional support to fulfill

Special Populations & Youth Development Support

> Special Populations:

- Special education and English language learner instructional coaches work with schools to improve instruction
- Network staff work with schools to ensure that students with disabilities and English Language Learners receive their mandated services

> Youth Development:

- The network uses partnerships with community based organizations to expand the opportunities available to students, particularly in the areas of student engagement and positive tone and culture
 - Example: Norman Thomas High School in Manhattan partners with Big Brothers and Sisters of America, the Sports and Arts Foundation, the NYPD, and more
- Network helps schools develop more intensive outreach procedures to improve attendance and decrease negative discharges
