Two contracts: Boys & Girls Republic; Good Shepherd

*Service(s): The Division of Alternative High Schools and Programs, District 79, is requesting a scope of work amendment to contracts with Boys & Girls Republic and Good Shepherd. These vendors have been providing transitional services for ninth-graders through the New Beginnings program. However, District 79 has announced that the New Beginnings programs will be discontinued at the end of the current school year. New Beginnings and one-year suspension center programs are largely similar, as are the services and facilities requirements. This exception will enable these vendors to provide one-year suspension center services to the middle and high school students of District 79 in lieu of the previously contracted New Beginnings services.*

*The term of each agreement will be for one-year, from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008. It is anticipated that the total contract cost will be \$350,000 per vendor, or \$700,000.*

*Service(s): Region 5 is requesting approval for a negotiated acquisition with Core Knowledge to provide a scientifically based sequential curriculum in social studies, science, visual arts, and music for grades Pre-K-8; Grades 9-12 in visual arts and music. Additionally, Core Knowledge will provide the consultant training and materials to familiarize participants with the content and sequence of the Core Knowledge curriculum.*

*The term of this agreement will be for 5 years from June 1, 2007 through May, 30, 2012, at an annual cost of \$500,000.*
