Central Brooklyn Ascend Charter School, located at 1501 Pitkin Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11212 in CSD 14, currently serving approximately 208 students in grades K-1, requests to change the school's curriculum from the SABIS curriculum to the Ascend Common Core Curriculum to allow further alignment to the Common Core standards.

The mission of Central Brooklyn Ascend Charter School is to equip every student with the knowledge, confidence, and character to succeed in college and beyond. Students will, from the earliest grades, steadily build a strong foundation of learning habits, critical-thinking skills, and knowledge; excel academically as they progress through the program, mastering high-level math and science; and graduate as confident young adults, prepared to succeed as college students, citizens, and leaders in their chosen fields.
