

Diversity in Admissions Pilot

Academy of Applied Mathematics and Technology (07X343)

The Academy of Applied Mathematics and Technology aims to create a middle school that truly represents all of the neighborhoods and communities across District 7. They will be piloting a new admissions policy starting with students applying this fall to enter sixth grade in September 2018. Through this pilot, the school seeks to serve an incoming sixth grade class of students attending elementary schools that historically have been underrepresented at the school.

As part of the admissions pilot, the school will:

- **Prioritize up to 25% of seats for applicants currently attending the following District 7 Elementary Schools: PS 1, PS49, PS 154, PS 277, PS 359, and PS 369**
- **Prioritize up to 15% of seats for applicants currently attending the following District 7 Elementary Schools: PS 5, PS 18, PS 25, PS 29, PS 31, PS 157, and PS 161.**

Students from all other elementary schools, and any remaining applicants from the above elementary schools, will be considered as part of the larger applicant pool for all remaining seats.

Families of students in District 7 who attend the elementary schools listed above, and all other interested students, are encouraged to apply by ranking the program on their Middle School Application, which is due to elementary schools on **December 1**. Students with Disabilities (SWD) participate in the admissions process in the same manner as their General Education peers. As per DOE policy, The Academy of Applied Mathematics will admit the number of SWDs equivalent to the percentage of students in the district.

The Academy of Applied Mathematics and Technology admits students through an **Unscreened** admissions method. For their admissions process, students are selected randomly for the available seats.
