

**Resolution Regarding Approval of the Proposed Co-Location of a New Public Charter School, Brooklyn Success Academy, with Existing Schools Urban Assembly School for Urban Environment (14K330), Foundations Academy (14K322), a District 75 School (P368K@I033K) and an Alternative Learning Center in School Building K033**

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-h(2-a), the Chancellor prepared an educational impact statement, published and filed on January 14, 2011, on the proposed co-location of a new public charter school, Brooklyn Success Academy (“Brooklyn Success”), with existing schools Urban Assembly School for Urban Environment (14K330) (“Urban Environment”), Foundations Academy (14K322) (“Foundations”), a District 75 school (P368K@I033K) and an Alternative Learning Center (“ALC”) in school building K033 (“K033”); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-g(8), the Panel for Educational Policy (the “Panel”) undertook a public review process for review and comment on the proposed co-location of Brooklyn Success with Urban Environment, Foundations P368@I033K and the ALC in K033; and

WHEREAS, such review process included notice of the proposal via the New York City Department of Education’s (the “Department”) internet website and circulation of the notice of the proposal to all community superintendents, community district education councils, community boards, and school based management teams; and

WHEREAS, such notice further included: a) a description of the purpose and substance of the proposed co-location; b) information regarding where the full text of the proposal could be obtained; c) the name, office, address, email and telephone number of the Department representative from whom information concerning the proposal could be obtained; d) the date, time, and place of any hearing on the proposal; e) the date, time and place of the meeting of the Panel at which the Panel will vote on the proposal; and f) information on how to submit written or oral comments regarding the proposal; and

WHEREAS, such notice and public review process commenced on January 14, 2011, at least forty-five days in advance of the March 1, 2011 meeting of the Panel at which the proposed co-location of Brooklyn Success with Urban Environment, Foundations P368@I033K and the ALC in K033 came before the Panel for a vote; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-h(2-a)(d-1), the Chancellor has held a joint public hearing on the proposal with the District 14 Community Education Council and the impacted school leadership teams at which all interested parties had an opportunity to present comments or concerns on the proposal; and

WHEREAS, following the public review and comment period, the Panel made available to the public, including via the Department’s internet web site, an assessment of all public comments concerning the proposed co-location of Brooklyn Success with Urban Environment, Foundations P368@I033K and the ALC in K033; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public comments included a summary and analysis of the issues raised and any significant suggested alternatives; a statement of the reasons why any significant alternatives were not incorporated into the proposed co-location; a description of any changes to the proposed co-location as a result of the public comments; and information regarding where the full text of any approved proposed co-location of Brooklyn Success with Urban Environment, Foundations P368@I033K and the ALC in K033 may be obtained; and

WHEREAS, the Chancellor recommends that the Panel for Educational Policy approve the proposed co-location of Brooklyn Success with Urban Environment, Foundations P368@I033K and the ALC in K033; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Panel for Educational Policy to approve the proposed co-location of Brooklyn Success with Urban Environment, Foundations P368@I033K and the ALC in K033; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that in accordance with Education Law § 2590-g, the Panel for Educational Policy hereby approves the proposed co-location of a new public charter school, Brooklyn Success Academy, with existing schools Urban Assembly School for Urban Environment (14K330), Foundations Academy (14K322), a District 75 school (P368K@I033K) and an Alternative Learning Center in school building K033.
