


Support to Schools for the Implementation of Core Curriculum in 2013—14

What support is being offered to my school?

- All K–8 ELA and math teachers and school leaders will have the option to attend a series of four (4) professional development sessions for each new Core Curriculum program (Core Knowledge, Expeditionary Learning, Go Math!, ReadyGen, Connected Math Program 3, and Code X).
- A smaller subset of teachers and school leaders (K–12, ELA, math, social studies, science) will have the option to attend five (5) additional professional development sessions focused on the integration of the Common Core shifts to complement these supports for the purpose of sharing work back at their schools using existing school structures such as teacher team meetings.
- All participants in both sets of sessions will be able to access a set of online resources to accompany each Core Curriculum program. Other online supports will also be forthcoming.
- Network teams will work with schools between sessions as well as provide additional supports as needed.

When and where will professional development sessions take place?

- Participants will be able to choose among various dates and locations for each session.
- The first of the four sessions will take place this summer. Dates, locations, and registration information will be provided in *Principals' Weekly* by the first week of June.
- Dates, locations, and registration information for all other sessions will be provided this summer.

How will this work be funded?

- Funding allocations to support the implementation of the citywide instructional expectations will be made available this summer. These funds may be used for work conducted during the summer and throughout the school year. Per session circulars for teachers and administrators were posted centrally on May 15.

What are my next steps?

- Work with your staff so that teachers, coaches, and other school leaders can apply for summer professional development per session opportunities.
- Continue to develop structures that will support knowledge sharing among teachers regarding Core Curriculum implementation and the integration of the Common Core instructional shifts.
