

**Resolution Regarding the Proposed Grade Truncation of P.S. 152 Gwendoline N. Alleyne School (30Q152) from a K-6 School to a K-5 School Beginning in the 2015-2016 School Year**

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-h(2-a), the Chancellor prepared an educational impact statement (“EIS”), published and filed on October 8, 2014, on the proposed grade truncation of P.S. 152 Gwendoline N. Alleyne School (30Q152) from a K-6 school to a K-5 school beginning in the 2015-2016 school year (the “proposal”); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Law § 2590-g(8), the Panel for Educational Policy (the “Panel”) undertook a public review process for review and comment on the proposal; and

WHEREAS, such review process included notice of the proposal via the Department of Education’s (the “Department’s”) internet website and circulation of the notice of proposal to all community superintendents, community district education councils, community boards, and school based management teams; and

WHEREAS, such notice further included: a) a description of the purpose and substance of the proposal; b) information regarding where the full text of the proposal could be obtained; c) the name, office, address, email, and telephone number of the Department representative from whom information concerning the proposal could be obtained; d) the date, time, and place of any hearing on the proposal; e) the date, time, and place of the meeting of the Panel at which the Panel was to vote on the proposal; and f) information on how to submit written or oral comments regarding the proposal; and

WHEREAS, such notice and public review process commenced on October 8, 2014, at least forty-five days in advance of the January 29, 2015 meeting of the Panel at which the proposal came before the Panel for a vote; and

WHEREAS, on November 25, 2014, the Department issued an amended notice for the proposal which announced that the proposal would be considered at the Panel’s December meeting on December 16, 2014; and

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2014, the Department issued a second amended notice for the proposal which announced a change in the date and location of the Panel’s December meeting; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2014, the Department issued a third amended notice for the proposal which announced that the proposal would be considered at the Panel’s January meeting on January 29, 2015; and

WHEREAS, on January 26, 2015, the Department issued a fourth amended notice for the proposal which announced a change in location for the Panel vote on the proposal; and

WHEREAS, on January 28, 2015, the Department issued a fifth amended notice for the proposal which announced that the location of the Panel vote on the proposal would be changed back to the originally-noticed site; and

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2014, in accordance with Education Law 2590-h(2-a), the Chancellor held a joint public hearing on the proposal with the District 30 Community Education Council and the impacted school leadership team, at which all interested parties had an opportunity to present comments or concerns on the proposal; and

WHEREAS, following the public review and comment period, the Panel made available to the public, including via the Department's internet web site, an assessment of all public comments concerning the proposal; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public comments included a summary and analysis of the issues raised and any significant suggested alternatives; a statement of the reasons why any significant alternatives were not incorporated into the proposal; a description of any changes to the proposal as a result of the public comments; and information as to where the full text of any approved proposal may be obtained; and

WHEREAS, the Chancellor recommends that the Panel approve the proposal; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Panel to approve the proposal; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that in accordance with Education Law § 2590-g, the Panel for Educational Policy hereby approves the proposed grade truncation of P.S. 152 Gwendoline N. Alleyne School (30Q152) from a K-6 school to a K-5 school beginning in the 2015-2016 school year.
