

Description of Zone Changes for P.S. 86 and P.S. 182 in District 28
Beginning in the 2016-2017 School Year

On May 7, 2015, Community Education Council 28 voted to change the current zones for P.S. 86 and P.S. 182 in District 28 and to create an elementary school zone for new building Q314. The approved zone changes for the 2016-2017 school year may be found in the map provided below.

Why did the CEC approve this zone change?

- To create an elementary school zone for the new elementary school in new building Q314, located at 88-08 164th Street. The new school is opening for the 2015-2016 school year; however, the proposed zone would be implemented for the 2016-2017 school year
- To alleviate the overcrowding in the P.S. 182 and P.S. 86 kindergarten zones and eliminate the need to overflow students from P.S. 182 and P.S. 86

What changes should families expect as a result of this rezoning?

- Some residents in the southeast portion of the P.S. 86 zone will now be zoned for the elementary school in building Q314.
- Some residents in the southern portion of the P.S. 182 zone will now be zoned for the elementary school in building Q314.

What will this mean for my family?

The approved changes would impact only incoming pre-kindergarten or kindergarten students or students that are new to the system in 2016-2017. All currently enrolled students may remain in their school. Children entering pre-kindergarten and kindergarten whose verified siblings are enrolled in a school impacted by a rezoning plan adopted by the CEC will maintain zoned sibling priority to that impacted school.

A. Students will be enrolled in New York City pre-kindergarten programs by the following priority:

1. Students residing in the zone, who have a sibling at the school in grades K-5 in September 2015.¹
2. Students residing in the zone, who do not have a sibling at the school.¹
3. Students residing in the district, who have a sibling at the school,
 - a. who have no zoned school or whose zoned school has no pre-K program, then
 - b. who are zoned to a different school which has a pre-K program.
4. Students residing in the borough, who have a sibling at the school.
5. Students residing out-of-borough, who have a sibling at the school.
6. Students residing in the district,
 - a. who have no zoned school or whose zoned school has no pre-K program, then
 - b. who are zoned to a different school which has a pre-K program.
7. Students residing in the borough.
8. Students residing out-of-borough.

B. Students will be enrolled in New York City elementary schools by the following priority:

1. Zoned students whose verified siblings are pre-registered or enrolled at the time of application submission and will be enrolled in grades K-5 in the school at the start of the following school year
2. Zoned students other than those in (1) above applying to the zoned school

3. Students whose verified siblings are pre-registered or enrolled at the time of application submission and will be enrolled in grades K-5 in the school at the start of the following school year who are not zoned to the school,
 - a. Within District first, then
 - b. Out of District
4. Students currently attending the school's pre-kindergarten program who reside outside the school's zone, *without* a sibling who will be in grades K-5 at the school in the following school year,
 - a. Within District first, then
 - b. Out of District
5. Students other than those in (3a) and (4a) above who are residents of that district
6. Students other than those in (3b) and (4b) who are residents of another district

New, Approved Zones (2016-2017):

The yellow shape represents the current zone for P.S. 86 and the purple shape represents the current zone for P.S. 182. The black outline represents the new zone boundaries. All zone lines run down the center of the street with the exception of 164th Street between Hillside Avenue and 89th Avenue, which includes both sides of the street. Starting in 2016-2017, the new zone for the elementary school in Q314 is determined by the shape outlined in black:
