



NYC School Survey Citywide Results

Participation rates remain high, with record high parent participation




A majority of parents participated in all boroughs

Parent, student, and teacher satisfaction remained high across domains




Parents indicate high satisfaction with schools



I am safe in the hallways, bathrooms, and locker rooms at my school.





My school sets high standards for student learning.


Order and discipline are maintained at my school.

My school does a good job supporting students who aspire to go to 2- or 4-year colleges.


The principal at my school makes clear to the staff his or her expectations for meeting instructional goals.

Teachers at my school understand the Common Core Learning Standards.



The current Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory teacher evaluation process in New York City helps teachers improve their instructional performance by providing specific and useful feedback.



Over 75 % of teachers responded that they received professional development or coaching based on a research-based rubric of teacher practice



This school year, I have received professional development or coaching on the research-based rubric of teacher practice.




Satisfaction with the Schools Chancellor

Parent Satisfaction




Teacher Satisfaction





