BGLIG revised the language in the charter to reflect that the school would be using the NYCDOE Learning Environment Survey in place of a school-based one to gauge satisfaction. This allows the school to focus on getting a higher response rate from parents, students and teachers, rather than attempting to get responses on two surveys and getting lower response rates on both surveys.
