PARTICIPATING IN KINDERGARTEN ADMISSIONS

Kindergarten is the start of your child's journey through elementary school. There are nearly 800 elementary schools throughout New York City.

All children living in NYC who were born in 2012 will begin kindergarten in September 2017. Kindergarten is an important next step in your child's education to set them up for success.

All children born in 2012 are guaranteed a kindergarten seat in school. Once your child starts kindergarten, they can remain at that school until its final grade.

All families should submit a kindergarten application, including current pre-K students, students with disabilities, and English Language Learners. For more information on how the NYC Department of Education meets the needs of all children, please see Section 6.0.

There are four steps to participate in Kindergarten Admissions:

- 1 Understanding your Kindergarten options
- 2 Applying to Kindergarten
- 3 Receiving a Kindergarten offer
- 4 Accepting your offer and pre-registering for Kindergarten

UNDERSTAND YOUR KINDERGARTEN OPTIONS

District 1 is a choice district, and all schools in the district are called "Choice Schools." There are no zoned schools in the district.

Children living in District 1 have priority to attend all schools in the district.

2.1 Find Your District

There are 32 school districts in NYC. This directory outlines all school options in District 1.



Call 311 or visit schools.nyc.gov/SchoolSearch to learn what district you live in.

2.2 Understand Your School Options

There are three types of schools you can list on your kindergarten application—zoned schools, non-zoned schools, and choice schools.

District 1 only has choice schools. If you live in District 1 you can apply to other types of schools outside of the district, but your child has a higher chance of getting into a school in the district.

2.2.1 Zoned Schools: Zoned schools make offers to students that live in their zone first. Most zoned schools make kindergarten offers to all students living in the zone. Some zoned schools have room to make offers to children living outside of their zone.

2.2.2 Non-Zoned Schools: Non-zoned schools do not have a zone. This means that no addresses are assigned to them and that families from throughout the district or borough can attend non-zoned schools. At most non-zoned schools, students who live in the school's district will get offers before students living outside the district. Sibling status and other criteria are also used to make offers.

2.2.3 Choice Schools: There are three districts in NYC that have no zoned schools. The schools in these districts are called Choice Schools, and students living in these districts have priority to attend all schools in the district. These districts are:

- **District 1:** Lower East Side-Manhattan
- **District 7:** South Bronx
- **District 23:** Brownsville-Brooklyn

2.3 Visit Schools

Many schools offer tours so families can visit and learn more about them. To find out when you can visit a school, contact schools directly or visit schools.nyc.gov/Kindergarten.

2.4 Use the Kindergarten Directory

Use this directory to research your school options. This directory lists all the elementary schools in District 1. It also has a map of all school options. Charter elementary school options are listed on the map and at the end of this directory.

This sample school page shows you the typical information listed for an elementary school in this directory; keep reading to learn how to use this information to research each choice for your Kindergarten Application.

2.4.1 School Overview: Learn if the school is a Zoned School, Non-Zoned School, or Choice School.

All schools serve students with disabilities, and are expected to provide the special education programs and services listed on students' IEPs. Most students with IEPs will attend their local district schools, just like their general education peers. Families of students with disabilities should apply to kindergarten in order to secure a kindergarten seat.

Section 6.1 shares more information on how the Department of Education serves students with disabilities.

All schools will meet the needs of English Language Learners (ELLs). The Department of Education provides a range of programs and supports to students learning English to ensure that they develop the English language skills necessary to excel. There are three main types of programs designed to serve ELLs: English as a New Language, Transitional Bilingual Education, and Dual Language.

All schools offer English as a New Language programs. Some schools offer other programs, like Dual Language and Transitional Bilingual Education. These additional programs will be listed on a school's page in the directory.

Section 6.2 shares more information on how the Department of Education serves students learning English.

2.4.3 School Information: Find out how to get in touch with the school's staff. We encourage you to reach out in person, by phone, or by email to the schools you are interested in.

You can also learn if the school shares a building with another school or program. This section also lists which English language support services and programs that the school offers.

If the school offers a Gifted & Talented program, it is noted in this section.

Lastly, if the school is a magnet school, it is also noted in this section. A magnet school is a public school that offers a school-wide curriculum designed around a specific theme. While some schools have the word “magnet” in their school’s name, only those schools that received Magnet Schools Assistance Program (M.S.A.P) funding will be designated as magnet in this directory.

2.4.5 School Performance: Find out the percentage of third, fourth, and fifth graders who scored proficient in English and Math in the 2015-2016 school year. 2.5 List Your School Choices

You can list up to 12 school choices on your kindergarten application. You should list schools in order of which you like the most. You can apply directly to a school’s Dual Language program. If you are interested in applying to these programs, be sure to list the correct program code on your application.

The Department of Education will try to give you an offer to the highest choice on your application. Many programs have more applicants than seats. When this happens, we make offers to families with the highest priority to go to that school. This means a school would make offers to families living in District 1 before making an offer to someone living outside of the district.

3.0 APPLY TO KINDERGARTEN BY JANUARY 13, 2017

Once you pick your school choices, you are ready to submit your kindergarten application. You can apply to kindergarten from November 30, 2016 through January 13, 2017. You can apply online, by phone, or in person; ask for and save your receipt no matter how you apply.

All families should submit a kindergarten application, including current pre-K students, students with disabilities, and English Language Learners. Current pre-K students do not automatically stay at their school for kindergarten.

Only one application can be processed per child and only the primary custodial parent/guardian can submit an application. Where there are joint custody agreements, if there is no specific provision addressing school decision-

making, the parent who has primary physical custody of the child during the school week is considered to be the custodial parent.

Note: Admission is not first-come, first-served. All applications received online, by phone, or in person by the January 13, 2017 deadline are treated the same based on admissions priorities.

- Apply in Arabic, Bengali, Chinese, English, French, Haitian Creole, Korean, Russian, Spanish, and Urdu

- Call Monday through Friday 8am-6pm
- The deadline to apply over the phone is Friday, January 13, 2017 at 6pm
- Apply in over 200 languages—if you speak a language other than English, ask for an interpreter

3 In person at a Family Welcome Center

- Open Monday through Friday 8am-3pm; locations are listed on the cover
- The deadline to apply in person is Friday, January 13, 2017 at 3pm
- Apply in over 200 languages—if you speak a language other than English, ask for an interpreter

Families who apply online must use their own email address. If you do not have an email address and/or do not wish to provide an email address, please apply over the phone or in person.

3.2 Additional Public School Kindergarten Options

The below programs and schools all have separate application processes.

3.2.1 Gifted & Talented Programs: Gifted & Talented (G&T) programs are one way the NYC Department of Education supports the educational needs of students with unique academic abilities. For more information about G&T Admissions, please visit schools.nyc.gov/GiftedandTalented.

- All families are encouraged to participate in both the kindergarten and G&T admissions processes.
- Families interested in having their children tested to determine G&T eligibility should have submitted their Request for Testing (RFT) form by November 14, 2016.

- If your child is taking the G&T test, you will learn about your child’s test results in April. Your child will be eligible to apply to G&T programs based on his or her test score.
- If you missed the RFT deadline and are interested in having your child tested, please contact **EEnrollment@schools.nyc.gov** and we will make every effort to accommodate your request. Late requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, and there is no guarantee that your child will be able to test if you do not submit an RFT by the November 14, 2016 deadline.

3.2.2 Charter Schools: For a list of charter schools, please refer to the last section in this directory. Charter schools:

- Are public schools that operate independently according to the terms of a performance contract, or “charter,” that can last up to five years;
- Are free—they do not charge tuition;
- Commit to meeting or exceeding specific goals for academic performance;
- Are governed by non-profit Boards of Trustees—these are mainly comprised of unpaid volunteers and are responsible for such actions as establishing school policies, ensuring compliance with state and federal law, overseeing the school budget, and evaluating the school’s leader;
- Are reviewed regularly by their authorizers (state-sanctioned bodies with the power to create or renew charter schools); and
- Can be granted a renewal for up to five more years by their authorizers upon meeting or exceeding agreed-upon academic and operational goals and other standards of performance; this process repeats itself in cycles that depend on the length of each school’s most recent renewal.

3.2.3 Special Music School (03M859): If you are interested in applying to the Special Music School, please contact the school directly to schedule an audition. Families who audition should also list Special Music School on their Kindergarten Application through the main admissions process.

GET A KINDERGARTEN OFFER IN MARCH 2017

You will get your child’s kindergarten offer letter in March 2017. If you applied online, you will also get your offer letter by email. Your offer letter will list which school your child got a seat at for kindergarten. This letter will also tell you where your child is waitlisted.

We use admissions priorities to make kindergarten offers. Admissions priorities group students based on their priority to attend a school. Offers are made in order of admissions priorities from the highest group to the lowest group.

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The higher priority your child has to a school, the higher chance that your child will get an offer to that school. For example, if your child has an older sibling at a school you listed on your application, your child has a higher chance of getting an offer than a child who does not have a sibling.

4.1 District 1 Admissions Priorities

Children living in District 1 have priority to attend all schools in the district.

We make offer to District 1 schools in order, based on these admissions priorities:

1. Students who live in District 1, who are currently enrolled at a District 1 school for pre-K and choose their current school as their first choice for kindergarten**
2. Students who live in District 1, with a verified sibling in a District 1 school and choose the sibling's school as their first choice for kindergarten*
3. Students who live outside District 1, who have a verified sibling in a District 1 school and choose the sibling's school as their first choice for kindergarten*
4. All other students living in District 1 who choose a school as their first choice
5. Students who live outside District 1, who attend a District 1 school for pre-K and choose the school as their first choice**
6. Students who live in District 1, who could not be accommodated in their first choice
7. All other students who live outside District 1

* A sibling is defined as a brother or sister—including half-brothers, half-sisters, stepbrothers, stepsisters, foster brothers, and foster sisters—of the applicant, who lives in the same household, and is currently pre-registered or enrolled at that school in grades K-5, and will be enrolled at that school in grades K-5 in September 2017. This includes students enrolled in co-located District 75 programs in the same school building. Schools offer a priority to applicants with verified siblings in the school.

** Students who are currently enrolled in pre-K will only receive priority for admission in kindergarten at the school they are attending now. Not all schools have pre-K.

4.2 Waitlists

A school will have a kindergarten waitlist when there are more students that apply than kindergarten seats available at the school.

You will automatically be added to the waitlist for any school you ranked higher on your application than the school where your child received an offer.

For example, if you received an offer for the school you listed third on your application, you will automatically be listed on the waitlist for your first and second choice schools.

Schools contact waitlisted families directly if they are able to offer them a seat; no additional action is required of families on a waitlist at this point in the admissions process.

5.0 ACCEPT YOUR OFFER AND PRE-REGISTER BY APRIL 2017

Once you get your offer letter, you will need to accept your kindergarten offer. To accept your offer, families must go to the school in person to pre-register; we encourage families to contact the school to set up time to pre-register.

5.1 Pre-Registration

To pre-register you will bring your child and the required documents to the school where you got an offer. Pre-registering your child means you have accepted your offer and secured your seat. After you pre-register your child at the school where you got an offer, you can still get and accept an offer to a school where your child is on the waitlist or to a G&T program.

- Proof of your child's age (child's birth certificate, passport, or record of baptism)**
- Two of the documents below verifying proof of address**

- Lease agreement, deed, or mortgage statement for the residence;
- A residential utility bill (gas or electric) in the resident's name issued by a utility company (e.g., National Grid or Con Edison); must be dated within the past 60 days;
- A bill for cable television services provided to the residence; must include the name of the parent and the address of the residence and be dated within the past 60 days;
- Documentation or letter on letterhead from a federal, state, or local government agency, including the IRS, the City Housing Authority, the federal Office of Refugee Resettlement, the Human Resources Administration, or the Administration for Children's Services (ACS), or an ACS subcontractor, indicating the resident's name and address; must be dated within the past 60 days;
- A current property tax bill for the residence;
- A water bill for the residence; must be dated within the past 90 days;
- Rent receipt which includes the address of residence; must be dated within the past 60 days;
- State, city, or other government issued identification (including an IDNYC card), which has not expired and includes the address of residence;
- Income tax form for the last calendar year;
- Official NYS Driver's License or learner's permit, which has not expired;
- Official payroll documentation from an employer issued within the past 60 days such as a pay stub with home address, a form submitted for tax withholding purposes, or payroll receipt (a letter on the employer's letterhead is not adequate); must include home address and be dated within the past 60 days;
- Voter registration documents, which include the name of the parent and the address of residence;
- Unexpired membership documents based upon residency (e.g., neighborhood residents' association), which include the name of the parent and the address of residence;
- Evidence of custody of the child, including but not limited to judicial custody orders or guardianship papers; documents must have been issued within the past 60 days and include name of student and address of residence.

Note: Students in temporary housing, as defined by McKinney-Vento, are not required to submit documentation—including address, proof of date of birth, and immunization—in order to enroll. Schools must provisionally pre-register the student and then work with the Students in Temporary Housing liaison to obtain documentation.

5.2 Transportation

In New York City, attending a public elementary school **does not guarantee yellow school bus service**. Students who are eligible for specialized transportation will receive bus service. For general education students, if your child’s school is in a different district than where you live, school bus transportation will **not** be available. If your child’s school is in the district where you live, the Department of Education will use the table below to determine if your child qualifies for free or reduced fare transportation.

If your child is eligible for “Either Yellow Bus or MetroCard” in the chart above, your child will get a yellow school bus if:

1. The school has applied to the Office of Pupil Transportation for yellow bus service;
2. The student lives in the same district as the school; and
3. The Department of Education can reach the student and at least 10 other students on a bus route that does not exceed 5 miles in length when measured on the streets travelled by the bus through the stops on the route.

Eligible students who do not meet this criteria will get a MetroCard. This means that an eligible kindergarten student will get a MetroCard if:

- He/she goes to school in another district, or
- He/she lives so far from the school that the Department of Education cannot create an 11-person/5-mile bus route.

Families in the larger school districts such as 31 (Staten Island) or the larger districts in Queens should pay particular attention to this since students in these areas often cannot be reached on a 5-mile route.

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6.0 MEETING YOUR CHILD’S NEEDS

The New York City Department of Education is committed to meeting the academic needs of all students, including students with disabilities and English Language Learners.

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6.1 Students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs)

All schools serve students with disabilities, and are expected to provide the special education programs and services listed on students' IEPs. Most students with IEPs will attend their local district schools, just like their general education peers. Families of students with disabilities should apply to kindergarten in order to secure a kindergarten seat.

The Department of Education is committed to ensuring students with disabilities have access to quality education and, to the extent appropriate, instruction alongside their general education peers. 6.1.1 Evaluation for Kindergarten (School-Age) Special Education Services:

Some incoming kindergarteners will be eligible for school-age special education services. These students receive an Individualized Education Program (IEP).

If your child receives special education services in pre-K, he/she will be reevaluated to determine if he/she is eligible for special education services when he/she transitions to kindergarten.

If your child does not currently receive special education services, but you believe he/she may have a disability and may need special education services, please contact the Committee on Special Education (CSE) for your district of residence. 6.1.2 Special Education Services and Supports at Schools: All schools serve students with disabilities, and are expected to provide the special education programs and services documented on students' IEPs. 6.1.3 Specialized Programs in District Schools: Specialized programs exist within some district schools and are designed to meet the needs of students with specific disabilities. While most students are served in their local schools, some students may be eligible to attend a specialized program which is not available in every school. Some district schools offer one or more of the following specialized programs:

- Bilingual Special Education (BSE) Program
- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Nest Program and/or ASD Horizon Program
- Academic, Career, and Essential Skills (ACES) Program

6.1.4 Specialized Schools (District 75): District 75 provides highly specialized instruction in programs for students with severe disabilities, including students with autism, intellectual disability, emotional disturbance, sensory

6.2 Students Learning English

The NYC Department of Education provides a range of programs and supports to students learning English, called English Language Learners (ELLs), to ensure that they develop the English language skills necessary to excel. There are three main types of programs designed to serve ELLs: English as a New Language (ENL), Transitional Bilingual Education (TBE), and Dual Language (DL). All schools provide ENL programs; TBE and DL programs are available in certain elementary schools across the city.

- **English as a New Language (ENL):** ENL programs, which used to be called English as a Second Language or ESL, provide instruction in English with support in the students' home language so that they can learn to read, write, and speak English. Students in this program can come from many different language backgrounds, and English may be the only common language among them.
- **Transitional Bilingual Education (TBE):** TBE programs provide reading, writing, and other classes in English and in your child's home language. As students' English improves, time spent learning in English increases and time spent learning in the home language decreases. Once your child is no longer identified as an English Language Learner, he or she will exit the program.
- **Dual Language (DL):** In Dual Language programs, students are taught in two languages: English and their home language, such as Spanish, Chinese, or French, among others. The goal of this program is for students to be able to read, write, and speak in both English and their home language. In Dual Language classes, the home language and English are used equally.

DL programs aim for a balanced number of ELLs and English-speaking students; therefore, some seats may be reserved for ELLs. Additionally, schools may conduct an assessment and an interview with the child, to determine a child's home language and English proficiency.

If you are interested in a DL program, you must apply directly to that program, using the DL program code, on your kindergarten application.

6.2.1 Identification of English Language Learners (ELLs): As the parents or guardians of a newly enrolled student, you are required to complete a Home Language Identification Survey (HLIS) at the school within ten days of when your child first begins attending the school. This survey lets school staff know what language you use in your home. If the HLIS indicates that your child uses a language other than English, the school will determine whether he or she is eligible to be given an English proficiency test called the New York State Identification Test for English Language Learners (NYSITELL). How your child does on this test determines whether your child is entitled to ELL supports and services.

6.2.2 ELL Program Orientation: Selecting the Best Program for your Child: If your child has been identified as an ELL, you will be invited to attend an ELL parent orientation at your child's school within ten days of when your child first

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begins attending the school. During the orientation, you will fill out the Parent Survey and Program Selection Form and select the program that you believe best meets your child’s needs. If you do not receive this form, you can request it from the school.

All schools offer ENL programs, and all schools are expected to open a TBE or DL program when the families of at least 15 ELLs in a single language in one grade or two consecutive grades have requested that program. By selecting a TBE or Dual Language program on the Parent Survey and Program Selection Form, families help inform which ELL programs should be offered at schools.

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6.3 Students with Limited Mobility and/or Accessibility Needs

The NYC Department of Education is committed to providing students with limited mobility and/or accessibility needs with a kindergarten placement that allows the student to access all relevant programs and services.

Note: Accessible school placements are made *after* the kindergarten admissions process, and are based on documentation that details the student’s particular needs and the building accommodations he/she requires.

Accessible Schools or Programs are located in a fully accessible building or a partially accessible building where an individual with limited mobility may enter and access all relevant programs and services, including the science laboratory, library, cafeteria, and the gymnasium. In some cases, school programs may need to be re-located to accommodate access. At least one restroom is accessible.

All schools that are considered accessible are labeled as Fully Accessible or Partially Accessible in this directory.

The kindergarten application includes a non-admissions question that asks families to indicate whether their child has limited mobility and/or accessibility needs that would require an accessible school. **The answer to this question has no impact on the school offered through the kindergarten admissions process.** Rather, families who select “yes” or “not sure” are provided with additional information on the documentation they need to submit and the steps the Department of Education takes to identify placement.



