

Proposed Zone Changes Impacting M.S. 104 in District 2
Beginning in the 2017-2018 School Year

The New York City Department of Education (DOE) and the District 2 Community Education Council (CEC) have identified a need to create a zone for new middle school capacity and to change the current zone for M.S. 104.

Why is the DOE proposing to make these zone changes?

- To utilize new middle school capacity coming online at 75 Morton Street in the 2017-2018 school year, and to:
 - Ensure all students in the district have a zoned middle school seat
 - Address community concerns about travel distances and transportation
 - Plan for admissions to the new school

When would this zoning change be implemented?

- The proposed zone changes would take effect for the 2017-2018 school year.

What changes might District 2 families expect as a result of this proposed re-zoning?

- Some residents in the western portion of the M.S. 104 zone may now be zoned for the new middle school at 75 Morton Street.
- Residents living in the unzoned portion of the district will now be zoned for the new middle school at 75 Morton Street.
- The map on the back shows the proposed zone line changes.

Who does this rezoning proposal impact?

- Incoming 6th grade students or students that are new to NYC schools in 2017-2018.
- All currently enrolled students at M.S. 104 may remain in the school.

How will this rezoning change student enrollment and space at M.S. 104?

- M.S. 104's total enrollment is expected to remain constant from approximately 1,112 students to 1,077-1,206 students.

How will this rezoning decision be made?

- The DOE proposed zoning changes to the District 2 CEC at a public meeting on April 20, 2016.
- The CEC, ODP, and Superintendent collect community feedback.
- The CEC is responsible for approving zoning changes. CEC 2 anticipates voting on this proposal during their May 3rd meeting.
