

## Notice of Amended Educational Impact Statement

### **Proposal: Proposed Temporary Re-siting of P.S. 51 (02M051) in Building M816 Beginning in the 2011-2012 School Year and Proposed Opening of a New Zoned District Elementary School (02MTBD) and Temporary Co-location with Existing School P.S. 51 (02M051) in Building M816**

On October 3, 2011, the DOE issued Educational Impact Statements (“EIS”) for two proposals; one proposal is to extend the temporary re-siting of P.S. 51 to building M816, within the geographical confines of District 2 until September 2013, at which point P.S. 51 would move to its new site. A “re-siting” means the school, including students, teachers and administration will move from the current school building to another school building. The DOE also proposed to open a new zoned district elementary school in building M816 and temporarily co-locate it with P.S. 51 during the 2012-2013 school year. A “co-location” means that two or more school organizations are located in the same building and may share common spaces like auditoriums, gymnasiums, and cafeterias. The DOE has now issued an amended EIS for the proposal to temporarily re-site P.S. 51 to building M816 that corrects the address of P.S. 51’s former site, clarifies the status of nearby construction projects when P.S. 51 moves to the new site, and corrects typographical errors.

A joint public hearing regarding these proposals was held on Wednesday, November 2, 2011 at P.S. 51 / Building M816. A complete transcript of the hearing can be found at:
