School Summary	The mission of the school is to provide our students with the academic and character skills they need to excel in top colleges, succeed in a competitive world, and return as the next generation of leaders in our communities. Achievement First Bushwick Charter School, an existing charter school located at 125 Covert Street, Brooklyn, NY 11207 and 1300 Greene Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11237 both in Community School District 32, seeks a five year renewal of its charter to commence on August 1, 2014. According to the renewal application, the school would grow to provide instruction to approximately in grades K-12.

This school is authorized by the State University of New York (SUNY) Trustees. If the SUNY Trustees declines to renew the school's charter, the school will close at the conclusion of the current charter term. More information can be accessed at: www.newyorkcharters.org.
