Topic: Proposed Temporary Co-Location of a New School (20K264) with Existing Schools in School Building K989 and Eventual Move of 20K264 to a Newly Constructed Facility in 2012

Date of Panel Vote: January 26, 2010

### **Summary of Proposal**

This is a proposal to temporarily site a new school, 20K264, in school building K989, located at 415 89 Street, Brooklyn, in Community School District 20 (“District 20”). K989 currently houses P.S. 185 Walter Kassenbrock (20K185, “P.S. 185”) and P.S./I.S. 104 The Fort Hamilton School (20K104, “P.S./I.S. 104”). P.S. 185 and P.S./I.S. 104 both use K989 as annex space in addition to their main building. In 2010-2011, 20K264 will serve Kindergarten students with an enrollment of 60-75 students. Grade 1 will be added in 2011-2012. In 2012-13, the school will move to its permanent location in K264 where it will continue to add grades each year until it reaches its full PreK-5 grade scale. At scale, 20K264 will have an enrollment of 386-436 students.

An Educational Impact Statement on this proposal was published on the Department of Education’s website on December 11, 2009.

### **Summary of Comments Received at the Joint Public Hearing**

A joint public hearing was held at K989 on January 20, 2010, and all interested parties had an opportunity to provide input on the proposal. One person attended the joint public hearing and no one spoke.

### **Summary of Issues Raised in Written and Oral Comments and Significant Alternatives Suggested**

No written or oral comments were received on this proposal.

**Analysis of Issues Raised, Significant Alternatives Proposed  
and Changes Made to the Proposal**

No issues were raised regarding the temporary co-location of 20K264 with existing schools in school building K989 and eventual move of 20K264 to a newly constructed facility in 2012. Accordingly, no changes to the proposal have been made. The proposal will be presented to the Panel for Educational Policy as it is currently posted.
