The following Brief Calendar was adopted by the Board of Education at its Public Meeting on April 24, 1985. This Calendar mandates that school sessions begin for all students on Monday, September 9, 1985. The Calendar must be adhered to by all districts without exception.

This school year provides a total of 182 days at the elementary level in the Bronx, Manhattan and Staten Island; 181 days at the elementary level in Brooklyn and Queens; 183 days at the intermediate, junior high school and high school level in the Bronx, Manhattan and Staten Island; and 182 days at the intermediate, junior high school and high school level in Brooklyn and Queens.
2. Any district which, in violation of this officially adopted citywide brief calendar, closes a school or schools other than for those special emergency situations provided for under Board of Education policy and Chancellor's Regulations shall be assessed an amount equivalent to the costs caused by such closing.
