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Who we are

Transfer Schools:

Transfer Schools are small, academically rigorous high schools designed to re-engage and support students who have dropped out or who have fallen behind and now have fewer credits than they should for their age and grade. Transfer Schools offer a personalized learning environment in small class settings.

Students who are enrolled in a Transfer School:

- Attend regular classes Monday through Friday
- Participate in workshops and get support to prepare them for college, meaningful employment, healthy personal relationships, and life after high school
- Have access to tutoring, Regents prep and student support services
- Have the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities

LTW:

Learning to Work

Learning to Work (LTW) is an in-depth student support, job-readiness, and career exploration component of some Transfer Schools.



LTW helps students:

- Develop the skills to graduate high school and find employment
- Expand their knowledge of career and college options
- Plan for meaningful experiences after high school
- Secure paid internships

Students who enroll in a Transfer School with a LTW component can participate in LTW program activities, including:

Academic Support

- Academic tutoring
- Regents preparation assistance

Counseling

- Individual counseling
- Group workshops
- Support for conflict resolution
- Help achieving personal goals

College Preparation

- College workshops
- College fairs
- Visits to colleges and universities
- Assistance with applications and financial aid forms

Job and Career Development

- In-depth job-readiness and career exploration workshops
- Resumé development and writing
- Paid internships
- Assistance finding a job

Who you are

To be eligible for enrollment in a Transfer School, a student must:

- Be 15 to 21 years old
- Have completed one year of high school
- Apply directly to a Transfer School through its school-based process.

Admission criteria vary from Transfer School to Transfer School. Interested students are encouraged to apply directly to their school of interest.
