



NYC SAT, AP & PSAT Results 2013

In the Last Year, NYC Saw Gains in All SAT Subjects, While the Nation Stayed Flat or Declined





Performance on the SAT Has Increased for All Ethnicities


Black Students




Hispanic Students

White Students




Since 2002, the Number of Students Participating in and Passing AP Exams Has Doubled and Continued to Increase in the Last Year

PSAT Performance Increased in All Three Subjects

Since 2007, the PSAT has been offered for free for all Sophomores and Juniors. Participation has remained relatively steady since then with 114,193 participating in 2013.
