We host student teachers from NYU & other colleges. We are a barrier free site with full integration of on-site services, inclusion classes, and self-contained classes.

Our extracurricular activities include Literacy and Math Support. We also have enrichment clusters that include: computer, scrabble, digital video, Glee Clubs, Twisted Shakespeare, Delicious Math, Book Clubs, Saturday Scholars, Studio-in-a-School, BCUE, Broadway on 4th, Creating Original Opera, Sing, Speak, Play, LLSN, Dance, & 1 Minute Opera.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




