School Mission Statement

P.S. 151K, The Lyndon Baines Johnson School, is located in the Bushwick section of Brooklyn, where it upholds a high standard of academic excellence, thereby enriching the lives of the children in our care. The our motto is "Education is the Key to the Future" and we truly believe that all children can and do learn. Our school lives up to it, making tremendous strides in academic achievement. Our goal is to create an educational environment to enhance our teaching and instructional program and improve children's learning and achievement. Following the release of the Spring 2006 reading scores, our school was recognized as the top performing school in District 32 and in 2004 – 2005 we became a High Performing Gap Closing School. More than two thirds of our students are at or above grade level in math. P.S. 151K has been designated as an Enrichment School of the Arts, and offers Piano Lab, Violin Orchestra, Jazz Club and Ballroom Dancing.

Principal's Statement

All students at P.S. 151K in Grades K-5 are given instruction in Everyday Mathematics and are using a balanced literacy approach as demonstrated by Teachers' College. We provide students with bilingual classes and ESL instruction. In addition, all children are taught Social Studies, Science, Music, Art Instruction, Computer Technology, Fine Arts Program, Ballroom Dancing, Choir, and participate in Physical/Health Activities. Our Enrichment Clusters provide Photography, Journalism, Crocheting, Music, Dancing and Singing, Calligraphy, Fashion and Design, Technology and Art.

Special Academic Programs

We conduct honors classes for each grade, reading & math tutoring by teachers, after school reading, math, and bilingual programs, breakfast and lunch peer tutoring programs, and technology programs. Our school is currently participating in The Reading Excellence Act Grant.

Extracurricular Activities

Our extracurricular activities are Reading Club, Violin Program, Chess Club, School Gardening, Annual Field Day, Dance Festival, Multicultural Performance Celebration, Project Arts Exhibit, Dance Club, Choral Group, Band, Student Safety Patrol, Student Council, Science Fair, Math Fair, Math and Spelling Bees, & 100% Attendance Monthly Movie Night.

Community Support

We have partnerships with The NYC Police Dept., The NYC Fire Dept. Ladder 252, Penny Harvest, NYC Learning Leaders, Principal for a Day, Ballet Tech, and Carnegie Hall. Our school also participates in various writing and art contests as well as Music In The Brain, Studio In The School and Enrichment Clusters.

Parent/School Support

The Parents Association at P.S. 151 conduct fund raising activities, and many serve on the School Leadership Team as well. Some parents also participate as Learning Leaders in the classroom, and most take part in our Reading-at-Home Calendar Program. We also have a full time parent coordinator on staff to provide additional support.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




