Principal's Statement

P.S.206 is a PreK - 8 ethnically diverse high achieving school dedicated to the whole child. We provide programs for all students including Eagle Elementary, Middle School CIG, ELL, and Special Education. Our Extend Day, Title I, AIS, After School Reading and Math, Balanced Literacy, Math and Technology programs challenge and support students' skills. All programs including science, technology, health, art, music, and physical education are aligned to the NYC and NYS Performance Standards. Among annual events are the Spring Concert, Art Fair, and Science Fair and Character Education Nights.

Special Academic Programs

PS 206 offers Elementary Eagle programs as well as Middle School CIG. These programs for our gifted students provide an academically rigorous curriculum. We provide ESL services for LEP students and this is enhanced through Title III programs. Special Education students receive mandated services. We also offer Wilson Reading and AIS services.

Extracurricular Activities

We offer after school reading, math, science and social studies programs, Wilson Reading After School, Title III ELL instructional programs, Family Literacy, Extended School Day Program (SPINS) an after school recreational sports and art program, and an after school violin program for students, and parents.

Community Support

We have partnerships with Outward Bound Character Education, Brooklyn Chinese School, Brooklyn College, Kingsborough Community College, St. Joseph's College, St. Francis College, Turo College, Xavarian and the Brooklyn Philharmonic. We have received numerous grants from our local politicians to enhance technology and science and music programs.

Parent/School Support

We have a bilingual Parent Coordinator, active SLT and Parents Association. Parents serve as classroom volunteers, assist with fund raising and book fairs. Family English programs support our ELL parents. Parent workshops in guidance, test taking strategies, curriculum areas, and parenting skills. We have a Parents as Arts Partners Violin project.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




