Special Academic Programs

Montauk Intermediate School is a Magnet School where appreciation of different cultures is stressed, computer technology is available through wireless internet access into all classrooms, and students study a curriculum which includes art and music. The iTeach/iLearn Grant brings technological learning to all students.

Extracurricular Activities

There is a Virtual Y program, Mondays through Fridays, at IS 223. In addition, there are two SES programs, a Saturday ESL Academy, a Chess Club and an Explorers Program. There is an after-school class to prepare students for admission to both specialized high schools and the Arts high schools.

Community Support

The Virtual Y Program is supported by TASC. Montauk participates in community sponsored events with the 66th precinct, including the Explorers Program. Montauk participates in the Penny Harvest Program and the St. Jude's Mathathon.

Parent/School Support

Parents are involved in an active Parents Association. Parents are also involved in the School Leadership Team to help develop the Comprehensive Educational Plan. Montauk offers parents an ESL Saturday course in learning to speak English and a computer course.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




