School Mission Statement

We believe that all children have a right to an education that promotes creativity, high expectations and standards-based instruction through expert teaching. Our mission statement, "I BELIEVE IN ME", strives to foster and sustain a cultural and instructional program conducive to student learning; create lifelong learners by promoting literacy; help children acquire the strategies needed to apply academic concepts to new learning and include parents as partners in the teaching and learning process.

Principal's Statement

P.S. 225 was reorganized in September of 2002 to service children in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Eight. The diverse community we serve includes families from over 30 ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Teachers develop a thematic, interdisciplinary curriculum which provides meaningful and effective instruction to all of our students. Our English as a Second Language program provides intensive acquisition of language skills. Project Arts initiatives provide instructional enrichment through art, music and drama programs. This comprehensive academic program emphasizes student achievement in the content areas for all New York City performance standards.

Special Academic Programs

Elementary students receive 120 minutes of Balanced Literacy and 75 minutes of Math instruction daily. The Core Knowledge Middle School Curriculum provides extra time daily to acquire skills needed to meet standards. Classroom and mobile computer labs enhance instruction schoolwide. Our District 75 Inclusionary Program promotes the New Continuum.

Extracurricular Activities

Students can participate in school sponsored Arista-Archon Societies, Chorus, Basketball Team, Peer Mediation Conflict Resolution Program, Mentoring Program, Art Club, Chess Club and Math Club. In addition, before or after-school recreational and tutoring programs are funded each year.

Community Support

We actively encourage our school's partnerships with The Brighton Neighborhood Association, Coney Island Hospital, The After School Corporation(TASC),The Shorefront Y and the Trust For Public Land NYC Children's Gardening Program.

Parent/School Support

Parents participate as partners in the teaching and learning process. Parents are actively involved on the School Leadership Team. Topics at PTA meetings address issues of concern to parents. Correspondence home is translated into different languages. Volunteers are invited into the classrooms to share stories with children and chaperone trips.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




