School Mission Statement

Principal's Statement

David Ruggles Junior High School is located in the Stuyvesant Heights section of Brooklyn, New York. Our student population of 700 is heterogeneously grouped. We accept students entering grades 6, 7 and 8. The school is divided by grades into three houses. Each house operates independently of each other. Each house contains an Assistant Principal, Guidance counselor and supervisor. There are several community based organizations working within the school and after-school to provide our students with well-rounded experiences both academically and socially.

Special Academic Programs

The David Ruggles Middle School is organized into a whole-school instructional reform program. We offer Balanced Literacy and Balanced Mathematics.

Extracurricular Activities

Our wide range of extra-curricular activities include: Intra/inter-mural basketball, cheerleading, Step Team, Swimming, Chorus, Project Male, Big Sister Little Sister, Math Club, Science Club, Art Club, Chess and Flag football.

Community Support

Partnership with Children is a community based organization to provides counseling and Peer Mediation. Vanguard conducts afterschool programs Monday through Thursday and summer months. Project M.A.L.E. is a male mentoring group.

Parent/School Support

A parent body operated the Executive Board, conducts P.T.A. meetings, and participates on the School Leadership Team. Parents also serve as trip monitors, school volunteers and mentors. There is also a Parent Coordinator who meets with parents and conducts workshops and reading groups.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




