School Mission Statement

It is the mission of Dr. Susan S. McKinney School to provide a learning environment which recognizes that the security of belonging is essential to the students' development of confidence, academic achievement, social development, and connectedness to learning through education, communication, involvement, participation, facilitation, and support.



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Principal's Statement

Dr. Susan S. McKinney is a 6-12 performing and visual arts school which reflects the arts strand (Drama, Dance, Fine Arts, Instrumental/Vocal) for all grades.

The high school currently comprises Grades 9-12 and exposes its students to the various strands in the arts. Specifically, the school develops the individual artistic interests and talents of its students while preparing the students to meet the appropriate academic requirements.

McKinney is an AVID school with classes in grades 6,7,9 and 10, a Teacher's College labsite, a math/science partnership with New York University.

Special Academic Programs

McKinney is a full visual and performance arts audition based program for grades 6-12. The academic program is designed to provide students with accelerated and enriched instruction in the core subjects. Students receive pre-regents, regents and enrichment classes in Math, ELA, Science and AP classes. McKinney also has a full marching band.

Extracurricular Activities

McKinney Academic Enrichment Center (MAEC), an extended day program in reading, math, the arts, H.S. Prep., regents prep, college advisement, intramural competitive sports, chess, robotics and entrepreneurial leadership. PSAL Athletics (Girls/Boys Basketball, Track/Field, Baseball, Soccer) Cheerleading, McKinney Steppers.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




