School Mission Statement

Principal's Statement

Our school has been redesigned into four academies in order to provide our students and teachers with smaller learning communities. Each academy has its own uniform and logo. Our academies are thematic: Robotics, Business, Community Service, and the Arts. We have many after school activities: basketball, soccer, volleyball, yearbook, Art, the Harry Potter Book Club, and Honor Society. We have an active after-school SES tutorial program (Spectra, Platform Learning, Education Station, Excellence Everyday, Saturday Prep Academy, and our ESL after school and Saturday program. We do a great deal of community service through Brooklyn Academy.

Special Academic Programs

We are a pilot program for MS for NFTE (National Foundation for Teaching Entrepreneurship). We are an America's Choice school and participate in the Urban Advantage program. Public Color will be revitalizing our school through student art and volunteers. We are partnering with Brooklyn College to encourage students to pursue higher education.

Extracurricular Activities

Volleyball and basketball team; drama classes; formal peer mediation and conflict resolution programs; Honor Society; yearbook; Harry Potter Book and Movie Club; Rebuild your own computer club.

Community Support

We have partnerships with United Way that has an Attendance Improvement Dropout Prevention Program and The Brooklyn College Community Partnership program. Our Region has been instrumental in getting us a 3.8 million dollar building renovation.

Parent/School Support

Parents comprise fifty percent of our School Leadership Team. We encourage parents to participate in Learning Leaders - a volunteer program for parents. Our Parent Coordinator organizes parent workshops. We host CEC meetings. We conduct informational academy meetings for parents and the public.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




