School Mission Statement

The Dr. Daniel Hale Williams School P. S. 307 is a community school committed to excellence in all phases of school life as it ultimately prepares its students for a successful transition to middle school. A focus on the development of the whole child is central to the School's mission. Within this framework the School seeks to provide a standards driven instructional program enriched by foreign language study, inquiry based projects and technology. Extended day clubs allow for immersion in the arts, sports, leadership activities and academic support. P. S. 307 establishes partnerships with the local community and cultural institutions to extend, expand and deepen learning opportunities for all students.

Principal's Statement

A caring, orderly environment; small classes; ongoing assessment and monitoring of students' academic and social progress; a strong core curriculum and experienced teachers contribute to a rigorous academic course of study. Day enrichment programs include Studio-in-the-School, LEAP, ballet and chess. An on site health clinic, a peer mediation program and a student government organization are in place to enhance student life. Before and after school programs include dance, sports, art, math enrichment, chess, oratorical club, chorus, academic support and cheerleading. Parents serve as active volunteers and on various school improvement committees.

Reading and math benchmarks are set, Kindergarten-grade 5 participate in reading and writing workshops; intervention programs include: Read 180, Voyager, Wilson, Saturday School, before and after school tutorials; America Reads tutors; Foundations phonics in kindergarten; monthly awards assemblies; math enrichment; reading logs and book clubs






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




