Principal's Statement

In order to realize our mission we have put in place special programs. We are most proud of teachers' efforts to differentiate instruction through the incorporation of technology in the classroom, as well as the school's ability to provide targeted Academic Intervention services. We provide students with opportunities for project based and investigative learning. Students are encouraged to question and develop critical thinking skills, make predictions and explore concepts in order to make learning more meaningful. Professional development is geared to meet the needs of the school community.

Special Academic Programs

MS 354 implements a variety of programs to support students. We implement the Balanced Literacy and Impact Mathematics programs as well as Kaplan, Wilson, Skills Tutor and Great Leaps intervention programs. An after school program and the Saturday Academy supplement regular daily instruction.

Extracurricular Activities

The school's non-academic activities include: basketball, cooking, drama, dance, art, power point and step clubs. Additional programs will be implemented as we seek partnerships with Community Based Organizations.

Community Support

To date, we have formed partnerships with Caribbean Women's Association, the Census Bureau, Brooklyn Public Library and Creative Outlet Dance Theatre. We are still seeking additional partnerships as we continue our second year of implementation.

Parent/School Support

Parental involvement includes participation in the School Leadership Team and the Parent Teacher Association. The SLT has developed and implemented a mentoring program to support and nurture the social and emotional needs of select students. The school provides workshops to help parents support their children's academic and social development.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




