Principal's Statement

Lincoln has a diverse, multi-cultural student body. Over 28 languages are represented in our school. Students enjoy a rigorous academic life blended with a vibrant and rich array of student activities and sports. Students explore their academic interests through a wide variety of course offerings. Lincoln is home of the nation's top Photography Program, as well as a dynamic program in Animal Science. The Institute for Professions in Science serves students who are talented in the fields of mathematics and science; the Gilder Lehrman Honors Institute offers special courses in the study of American History and related humanities.

Special Academic Programs

The Institute for Professions in Science, a rigorous, challenging program in science and math; an Animal Science program; the Gilder Lehrman Honors Institute for the study of social studies and related humanities, and a Photography Program rated number one in the United States.

Extracurricular Activities

Activities include Key Club, Math Team, Mock Trial, Debate Club, FED Challenge, Conflict Resolution, Student Organization, and Cheerleaders. Lincoln fields twenty-six teams, including football, basketball, baseball, track, softball and swimming. Our facilities include a swimming pool, tennis courts, and a newly refurbished athletic field.

Community Support

We have 36 partnerships, including Brooklyn College, College of Staten Island, Kingsborough Community College, Metropolitan Museum of Art, and Polytechnic University. Lincoln has programs that link it with Cooperative ED, New York Aquarium, Coney Island Hospital, and Jewish Board of Family and Children's Services.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




