#### School Mission Statement

*The mission of James Madison High School is to provide an instructional program that addresses students' individual needs and interests and holds them accountable to high standards. We will do so by providing students with academic and enrichment opportunities as well as windows of access to all content areas through a balanced literacy approach, emphasis on numeracy and a focus on "big ideas." Through a rigorous standards-based curricula, we will develop a community of academically and socially prepared life long learners.*

#### Principal's Statement

James Madison is a highly successful urban high school that is above 100% utilization. In spite of the crowded conditions, we maintain high academic standards and offer students an array of elective classes, extra-curricular activities, enrichment programs and academic intervention services. Organized on the "House Model" to which teachers, guidance counselors, coordinators and assistant principals are assigned, students have a safety net upon which they can rely. The "Houses" at Madison are: Law, Bio-Med, Math, Humanities, Information Technology, Music and Art, International, Media Arts, Academy of Finance, MACCS and Instructional Support Services.

#### Special Academic Programs

We offer Advanced Placement in English, Math, Science, History and Foreign Language. Electives include major art, instrumental and vocal music, leadership and conflict resolution. We have an exemplary literacy program for struggling 9th and 10th grade readers.

#### Extracurricular Activities

ARISTA, Fidelitas, academic societies, Math Team, Science Research, SING, Musicale, Marching Band, Mock Trial, Moot Court and Model UN. We have nearly 30 sports teams including baseball, basketball, bowling, football, handball, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track, volleyball, wrestling & cheerleading, and over 30 in-school clubs.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




