Brooklyn College Academy is a 7-12th grade secondary school established by the NYC Board of Education in collaboration with the City University of New York. Using the resources of Brooklyn College, Brooklyn College School of Education, and other civic, cultural, and educational institutions of Brooklyn, our goal is to develop in our students respect and aspirations for themselves and their communities, and to provide a strong academic foundation for their transition from high school to college. Two Brooklyn College Academy sites offer academic school settings and enriched educational opportunities.

Special Academic Programs

College Now program for eligible students at Brooklyn College and New York City College of Technology; CAP program at Kingsborough Community College, summer programs at City College, summer Arts Scholarship program through NYU, standards based curriculum; community service program; and an external learning program with collaborative institutions.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




