#### School Mission Statement

*Our mission is to create an interdependent learning community where all students regardless of race, ethnicity or disability become strategic learners, capable of creatively and effectively processing information. #### Principal's Statement

The Brooklyn Studio Secondary School provides a nurturing, supportive environment for all students in an inclusion based setting. The goals of the program are to reduce isolation of students with disabilities, and provide every student with a challenging course of study that will provide them with the tools necessary for succeeding in college and beyond. The school uses flexible scheduling, cooperative planning, and collaborative (team-teaching) model for supportive services. The school provides a seamless transition from 6th through 12th grade that enables all students the opportunity to meet standards.

#### Special Academic Programs

Technology is available to all students. The High School offers advance placement in Calculus, English, World History, American History, and Psychology. Additionally, students are given an opportunity to take a sequence in new media and a College Now program with Kingsborough. The Arts Program includes dance, band, and numerous art classes.

#### Extracurricular Activities

The Brooklyn Studio Secondary School allows students to experience a wide range of extra curricular activities which includes the Debate Team, Dance Club, Drama Club, School Newspaper, Student Government, Bowling, Basketball, Tennis, Volleyball, Literary Club, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, and the Urban Fellowship Mentoring Program.

#### Community Support

The Brooklyn Studio Secondary School maintains a Partnership with the The Federation of Italian American Organization (FIAO), Brooklyn College, providing a wide range of extra and co-curricular activities. The Urban Fellows provide mentoring to our junior class.

#### Parent/School Support

The school provides parents with a Resource Center, Parent Coordinator and Technology Workshops, as well as ongoing communication in helping their children succeed. PTA fund-raising activities, support extra-curricular activities. Parents are an active part of our Leadership Team.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




