School Mission Statement

We are dedicated to creating an environment that fosters optimism, creativity, critical thinking, and lifelong learning. Through curriculum and instruction that are challenging and rigorous, we will maintain high academic standards that satisfy requirements for the Regents Diploma and prepare students for higher learning.



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Principal's Statement

Teachers Preparatory School offers a rigorous, challenging college preparatory academic program and a small, supportive environment to help students succeed. Our high school students have the opportunity to participate in one of two specialized programs: Teach for Tomorrow and the Arts Centered Program. We maintain small class sizes taught by a young, highly dedicated staff of teachers, and supported by a proactive guidance team. Our success can be measured by our having one of the highest attendance rates, lowest incident rates, and highest Regents passing rates among schools in Brooklyn.

Special Academic Programs

We offer A.P. courses in U.S. History and Government and English. We also have extended day instruction in all core subject areas. Students who have demonstrated academic success qualify for participation in the National Honor Society or National Junior Honor Society.

Extracurricular Activities

We participate in two PSAL sports: girls volleyball and boys basketball. We also offer an array of after-school activities including dance, step, international club, leadership academy, debate team, Model U.N., art, and drama clubs. Students in our pre-teaching program work with the elementary schools in the district.

Community Support

Teachers Preparatory is developing partnerships with various college level education programs in Brooklyn, including Medgar Evers College and Brooklyn College. We have partnerships with the elementary schools in the district. We also have partnerships with various cultural institutions and science museums in New York City.

Parent/School Support

The school offers various workshops directed at parents on issues of health care, finance, and understanding adolescent behavior. The school also holds various staff/parent functions, such as a cultural feast and a teacher/parent 'meet and greet'.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




