MS 45 houses three Academies: The 6th Grade Academy, the Rafael Cordero Academy for 7th Graders and the Science & Humanities Academy for 8th Graders. All three Academies offer an interdisciplinary, project based curriculum. The 6th Grade students are introduced to middle school with a well rounded curriculum that includes ELA, Social Studies, Math, Science, Technology, Spanish, Art and a course in Social/Organizational Skills. The 7th Grade Curriculum includes the use of NYC as a resource leading students on trips to the city's museums and cultural centers. The Science & Humanities 8th Grade Academy focuses on Internships and Community Service.

Special Academic Programs

We aim to make a difference one child at a time by providing ongoing enrichment activities: daily advisory, Scholastic Read 180, Wilson Program, Technology, Art & Social Studies Expos, Math & Science Fairs. Our VIP students are recognized at quarterly Honor Assemblies. Our schoolwide point system encourages good behavior and academic excellence.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




