Special Academic Programs

There is an emphasis on projects unifying literature and the Content Areas in all grades. Our cluster program includes Science, Social Studies, Art and Physical Ed.

Extracurricular Activities

Social Studies, Science and Art Fair are held during the Fall & Spring Parent/Teacher Conferences. Annually we have a Multi Cultural Festival, a Talent Show and a School-wide Carnival. The 4th & 5th grade Basketball team, our 5th grade Environmental Club and our Art Club are all ways we enrich the students.

P.S.83 collaborates with the following organizations: Columbia Teacher's College, Hunter College, My Own Book Program, The Say Yes to Education Foundation, Educators for Social Responsibility, Learning Leaders, the 92nd Street Y, Music Outreach, Allen Stevenson School. 




Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




