School Mission Statement

Principal's Statement

P.S. 102 has almost 400 students in grades Pre-K through 5 grade. We have a strong commitment to balanced literacy and the Everyday Math Program, in grades K - 5. We are fortunate to have a relationship with The Education Through Music program which provides all students with keyboard and choral instruction. We have a partnership with Hunter College, which allows the staff, parents and community to work together on the School Leadership Team. We advocate for the academic and social success of all our children.

Special Academic Programs

Our instructional and academic programs include having a partnership with Teachers College. We have two facilitators from T.C. one for grades Pre-K to 2 and one for grades 3-5. We have an After-School Program and an Early Morning Program for students who are at risk. Our music, visual arts and chess program all enhance student achievement.

Extracurricular Activities

We are fortunate enough to have many extracurricular activities which include: the Virtual Y Program, Education Through Music, the Horticultural Society, Cookshop, Chess club, honors Art and Music programs, the Road Runners Club, a boys and girls basketball team, Rosie's Kids, Siemens Corporation, and Healthy Schools.

P.S. 102 is affiliated with various community organizations, such as the Virtual Y, Hunter College, Department of Health Dental Clinic, Cook Shop Program sponsored by The Community Food Resource Org., Healthy Schools/Healthy Families, The Road Runners Club, The Brearly School, and The Freeman Foundation.

P.S. 102 has a Parent Coordinator as well as a P.T.A. who are all part of our School Leadership Team. We have monthly meetings, parent workshops in Literacy, Math and a Saturday ESL Program. 




Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




