School Mission Statement

At the Tito Puente Education Complex, we work as a community to support the growth of students intellectually, emotionally and through character development. Our community is composed of stakeholders including school personnel, families and local community organizations. We value the dignity and worth of each individual, whether adult or child, and recognize our responsibility to provide an educational program that stimulates and challenges each person to realize his/her maximum potential in a nurturing and caring environment free from violence and conflict.

Principal's Statement

The Tito Puente Education Complex is a middle school (grades 7-8) that is comprised of three programs: Tito Puente Performing Arts Academy, The Technical Institute for Multicultural Education and the Cognitive Learning Center. Through a grant from P. Diddy, we have a fully renovated state of the art library that acts as the hub for our school. Our Instructional program has been realigned to meet the needs of the learners that enter our community. Additionally, we share space with a District 75 program that services students with special needs. We house the Mt. Sinai School-based Health Clinic and the Virtual Y program.

Special Academic Programs

Our partnerships with the RoundAbout Theater and Union Settlement we infuse performance and visual arts into instruction. We work with a technology consultant developing the school website and connecting technology to the everyday curriculum. Our scholars 8th grade articulation program link families to private and specialized high schools.

Extracurricular Activities

We have the Virtual Y, JR Knicks Saturday Basketball Program, Extended Day Activities in Math, Science, the Performing Arts, Central Park Conservancy, Cycling Program on Saturdays, M117 basketball team and Road Runners Club.

Community Support

The schools in the Complex have a variety of collaborations with outside agencies. Some of the agencies are the Central Park Conservancy, the Harlem Meer Project, the Metropolitan Opera Guild, the Round-About Theatre, Union Settlement, Harlem Business Alliance, The Boys Club of America, and Teachers College.

We have a schoolwide Parent Association and School Leadership Team. We also have a school volunteer program where families assist with clerical duties, book fairs, and small group tutoring.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




