P.S. 132 (The Juan Pablo Duarte School) has a total population of 1,050 students. This population is housed in our Main and Annex buildings. The Main building is 100 years old and is the oldest building in the district. We have developed partnerships with private and community based organizations that have enabled us to offer a diversified range of academic, social, arts, and sports programs for our students. Our parents are active partners on the School Leadership Team. They work collaboratively with the school to support daily school activities and participate in the decision making process of the school.

Special Academic Programs

Our school is involved with the Teachers College Reading and Writing Project. We offer our English language learners a variety of programs such as transitional bilingual, dual language and ESL. Our support programs include: Turn Around for children, AIS Teachers, and Title I Reading and Math. Enrichment programs: Computer Lab, Project Arts.

Extracurricular Activities

Theater and Drama Program, Basketball, Soccer, Art Club, Glee Club, Ballet Tech, Boy Scouts, and Ballroom Dancing. The All The Way extended day program offers reading, math, piano, science, computer, chess, and Computer/Media literacy partnerships.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




