School Mission Statement

The mission of the Island School is to create an educational environment which embraces our families and recognizes the value of our diverse community of learners. Principal's Statement

The Island School provides an enriched, challenging program that serves children from Pre-K through grade 8. All students participate in enhanced literacy and mathematics programs which are customized to meet their instructional level. A state of the art Library/Media Center and a new Internet Café offer students an opportunity to explore multiple forms of technology. At Island School we value students' talents and offer a wide range of opportunities and mentorship including music, dance, visual arts, theatre, videography, photography and natural science workshop.

Special Academic Programs

The Island School has been designated by the NYCDOE as a training site for Schoolwide Enrichment. We offer our students rigorous balanced literacy and math curricula, advanced technology, Spanish as a Second Language, music, art, filmmaking, robotics, dance. Academically eligible students attend BARD H.S. Early College Prep Academy.

Extracurricular Activities

The school offers a wide range of enrichment activities during the school day, afterschool, Saturdays, during holidays and the summer. These include dance, theatre, sports teams, cheerleading, technology, lego robotics, filmmaking, violin, percussion, keyboard, academic tutoring, community service and mentoring.

Our school works with several community based agencies including: Counseling in Schools, Third Street Music School, The Center for Arts Education, Arts Connection, LEAP, Sports & Arts In Schools Foundation, PACE University, Teacher College, and more... 




Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




